Ms. Cailin Crockett is a Program Specialist in the U.S. Department of Justice Office on Violence Against Women, where she is on detail from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Administration on Aging and is advising on the inclusion of older survivors across programs funded by the Violence Against Women Act. Most recently, she worked as a Policy Advisor for the White House Advisor on Violence against Women, in the Office of Vice President Biden. A researcher, policy expert, and advocate, Ms.

Crockett has also worked as a Consultant to the United Nations Development Program advising on gender-based violence across the lifespan. In May 2016, the World Bank and other funders published a 33-page *Brief on Violence against Older Women*, for which Ms. Crockett was the lead writer. She and Bonnie Brandl co-authored *Survivors in the Margins: The Invisibility of Violence against Older Women*, which describes the intersections of domestic violence, sexual abuse, and elder abuse.

Ms. Bonnie Brandl is the founder and director of the National Clearinghouse on Abuse in Later Life (NCALL), a project of the End Domestic Abuse Wisconsin. She worked in local domestic violence and sexual assault programs prior to joining End Domestic Abuse Wisconsin more than 25 years ago. In addition, she was a steering committee member on the Elder Justice Roadmap project in 2014. Ms. Brandl has written national curricula for law enforcement, prosecutors, and victim service providers on elder abuse and has facilitated training for thousands

of professionals throughout the U.S. She has co-authored a book titled, *Elder Abuse Detection and Intervention: A Collaborative Approach*. Her numerous other published articles and manuals on abuse in later life have been distributed throughout the country. Ms. Brandl has a Masters in Social Work from the University of Wisconsin – Madison. She received the National Adult Protection Services Rosalie Wolf Award in 2008 and the Institute of Violence, Abuse, and Trauma Rosalie Wolf Award in 2016.
