Almost 1/2 were students

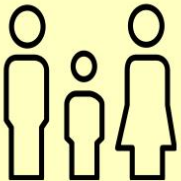

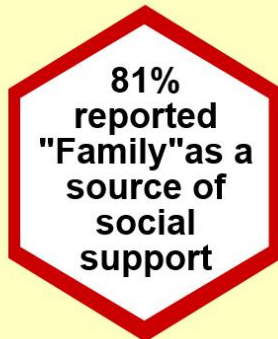

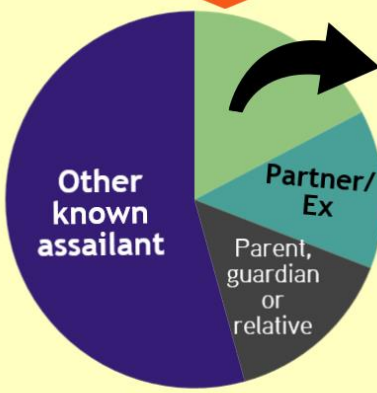

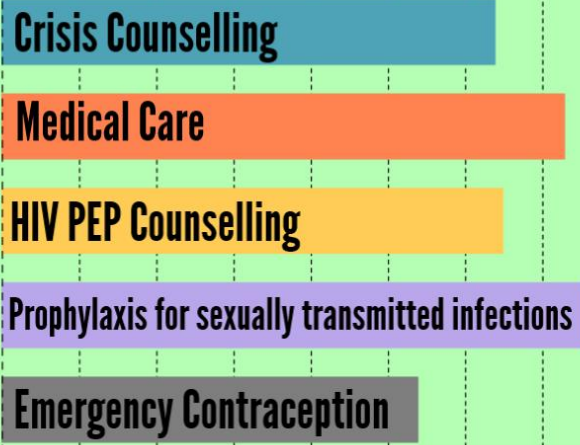
